




✓ Average jet fuel price increased to USD 77.8 per barrel, from USD 46.6 in 2020.




✓ WORLDWIDE : 446 Million tourists in 2021

✓ AFRICA : 18.9 Million tourists in 2021 (72.2% drop compared to 2019)



African Airlines Year-on-Year Freight Carried 2012 – 2021




AFRICAN AIRLINES PASSENGERS PERFORMANCE


AFRICAN AIRLINES CARGO PERFORMANCES





✓ The Covid pandemic is not over. The number of cases is once again on the rise and is affecting the activities. In some countries, lockdown measures are still ongoing, affecting the Air transport recovery.


Newly detected Omicron variants are responsible of a significant part of new infections around the World.

 ✓ Worldwide, the number of cases has reached 647 million and 12.7 million in Africa. The recovery rate is 98.98% worldwide compared to 98.01% in Africa.



✓ The Russia – Ukraine war is slowing global economic activity.


✓ The Global economy is now expected to grow by 2.9% in 2022, while earlier projections were around 4.1%.

FIGURE 1.1 Real GDP growth, 2019-23




- ✓ After a contraction in 2020, the GDP of Africa rebounded by 6.9% in 2021.
- ✓ The prospects for economic growth in Africa are highly uncertain. The effects of the Russian-Ukrainian conflict and related sanctions against Russia could lead to a more significant drop in global production than currently expected.
- ✓ The GDP growth for 2022 is estimated at 4.1%.


AFRICAN AIRLINES OPERATIONS



From January to November 2022:

- ✓ The capacity (ASKs) reached 75.4% of same period 2019, while the traffic (RPKs) reached 74.7%.
- ✓ The average load factor was 60.73%.


Passengers Revenue losses compared to 2019



✓ Estimated Revenue loss for 2022 : USD 3.5 billion, representing 20% of 2019 revenues.

✓ The percentage of international routes operated by African airlines exceeded the pre-Covid level, in November, representing **102.28%**.

Some airlines, particularly in West and North Africa are expanding their network, opening new destinations.




AIR TRANSPORT SUSTAINABILITY
